Digital Training Management System (DTMS) – Army's system of record for capturing training planned and completed – from unit level down to the individual Soldier. Future foundation for 'T' level reporting. https://dtms.army.mil/

Decisive Action & Regionally Aligned Training Environments (DATE /RAFTE) – The Army's foundation for operational environment training conditions.
